

In the middle of the second wave of Covid 19, on May 25, 2021, a severe cyclonic storm over the west-central Bay of Bengal moved north-westwards and intensified into a very severe cyclonic storm, **Yaas.** The storm caused torrential rains in various districts **in Odisha, and Medinipur and South 24 Parganas in West Bengal.** 

It affected around 10 million people in West Bengal and snatched their livelihood. More than 20,000 houses in West Bengal sustained some level of damage and it delayed displaced people from returning to their homes. The authorities had reported complete destruction of residential structures, including thatched huts, major damage to the road network, collapse of infrastructure, loss of crops and livestock.

# **COMMUNITY KITCHEN**

We distributed 1 lac meals all across 34 villages of Sunderbans and contributed 55 tonnes (approx) of raw materials for arranging these meals for 34,000 beneficiaries.

Kakdwip: 20,000 meals

• Raidighi: 40,000 meals

Canning: 20,000 meals

• Medinipur: 20,000 meals



#### **DRY RATION**

 We provided around 35.3 tonnes of essential grocery items containing rice, dal, oil, vegetables, etc. to help feed families across 40 villages. 240 cartons of biscuits and 390 cartons of cake were also distributed.

 Around 5,700 villagers had voluntarily helped to repair river embankments that had been ruined during the cyclone.
 They were supported with food grains



# **TARPAULINS & CLOTHES**

- We distributed 12,500 pieces of tarpaulin sheets to all those who lost the roofs over their heads
- We distributed 13,150 fresh garments and 20,000 masks to kids and adults



# **DISINFECTANTS**

To help control the outbreak of bacterial infection, we distributed lime, bleaching powder and other necessary items in the affected areas.


Bleaching powder- 20 MT worth ₹ 6 lacs



#### **MEDICAL CAMPS**

• With the help of the Mukti Foundation and Rural Health Care Foundation, we organized medical camps worth ₹ 30 lacs all across South 24 Parganas, including 43 villages in 10 blocks. The camps provided free medicines, doctor consultations and treatments. 8,000 masks and 720 sanitizers were also distributed to underprivileged people.

 The camps are still functional and 10,528 people have been treated to date



# **ANIMAL FEEDING SUPPORT**

We procured almost 60,125 kg of fodder to feed the cattle across
 42 villages in 17 blocks of the Sunderbans region

 2,405 cattle owners benefitted through the cattle feed distribution drive of Mukti Foundation, supported by Kolkata Gives

To ensure uninterrupted education in these difficult times, we donated 10,000 pens and 10,000 pencils from Linc and 8,000 pieces of exercise books amongst the children of the mangroves.
